RECIPE OF THE MONTH

English Apple Pie



This is my favorite apple pie recipe.

My grandmother made it for me every Thanksgiving.

Ingredients:

- 1 stick of butter
- ½ cup packed brown sugar
- 1 cup flour
- 2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 3 tbsp water
- ½ cup chopped pecans
- 4 large cooking apples, peeled and sliced (about 6 cups)
- ½ cup granulated sugar

Directions:

- 1 Blend butter and brown sugar until pale and fluffy.
- 2 Stir flour, 1 tsp of cinnamon, and 3 tbsp of water into sugar mix until smooth and thick.
- 3 Stir pecans into mix. Set aside pecan mix.
- 4 Mound apples in a 9-inch pie plate.
- 5 Mix granulated sugar with 1 tsp of cinnamon. Sprinkle sugar/cinnamon mix over apples.
- 6 Spoon pecan mix over apples in dollops using a spoon.
- 7 Bake on lowest rack of preheated 375° F oven for 45–50 minutes until apples are tender.

Cole's football team has played hard all season and has a winning season. We have one more game before we know if we make the playoffs.



Driverless Cars Coming to a Street Near You?

Drivers can't wait for self-driving cars, according to a survey by Bosch Mobility Solutions. Out of 1,000 United States based new car buyers 18 years or older, 52 percent said they expect to own a self-driving vehicle within the next 10 years. Only 14 percent said they'd never buy a self-driving car, and 14 percent were undecided.

Although 72 percent of survey participants signaled worries about lack of control in a vehicle they don't drive themselves, 61 percent said they believe self-driving cars could lead to a decrease in traffic accidents, and 55 percent highlighted more free time and less stress as a benefit to driverless cars.

Follow These Fireplace Safety Tips

The Fall is a perfect time for a fire in the fireplace. You'll want to make sure your fireplace is not a hazard to your home, though. Here are a few tips from the Hearth, Patio & Barbecue Association:

- Make sure to clear the area around the fireplace and chimney. Debris too close to your fireplace could cause a fire in your home.
- Always use a fireplace screen.
- Don't overload your fireplace with too many logs.
- Don't try to burn your Christmas tree or other refuse in your fireplace.
- Always keep a fire extinguisher on hand and equip your home with smoke detectors. Don't forget to check your batteries on a regular basis.
- Place your logs to the rear of your fireplace on a grate.
- Never leave the fire unattended. Make sure the fire is extinguished before you go to bed.
- Keep firewood stacked, covered and out of doors—away from the house and off the ground.
- Have your fireplace inspected annually. Make sure it is cleaned by a certified chimney sweep.
